

## Block Games (Directions and Player Cards)

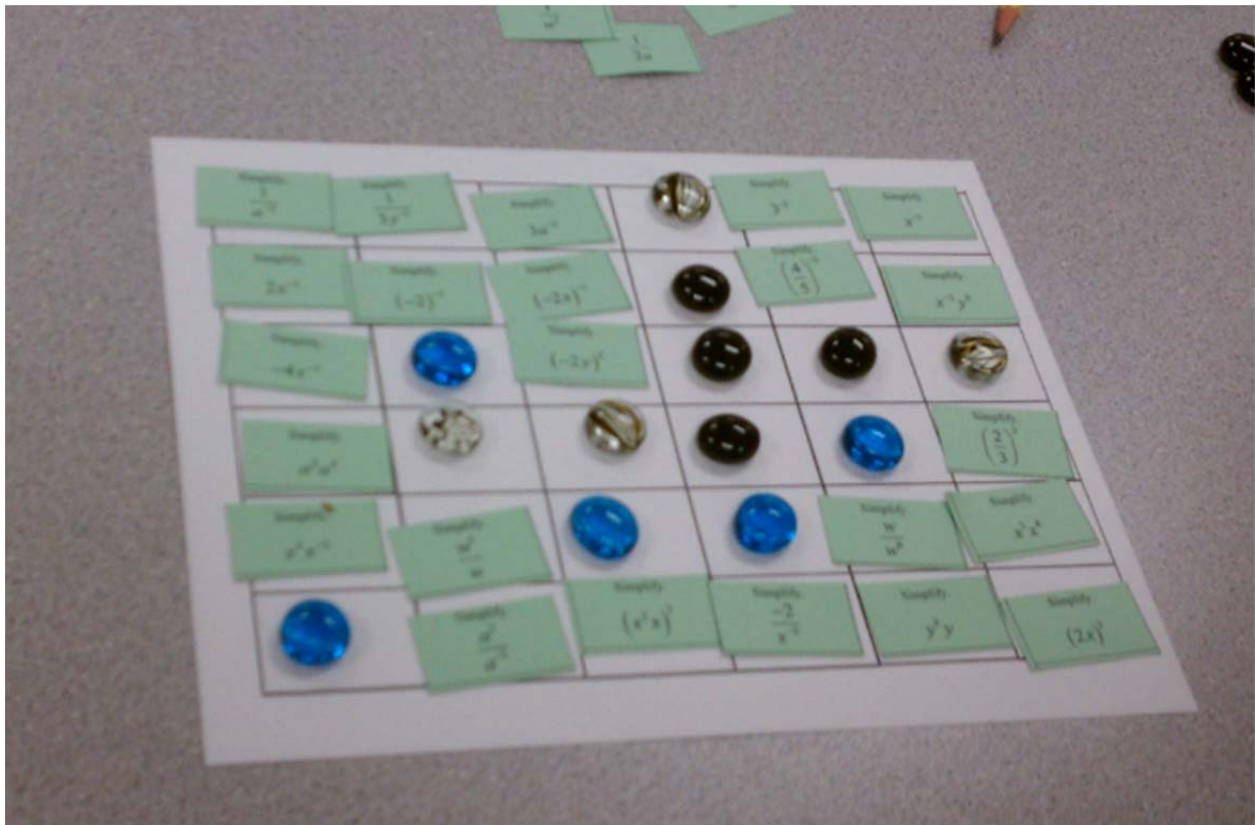
**Learning Goal:** The block games are designed to practice some skill. This is a (ideally) a two-player game, but can be modified for three players.

**Game Setup:** Print all materials on cardstock

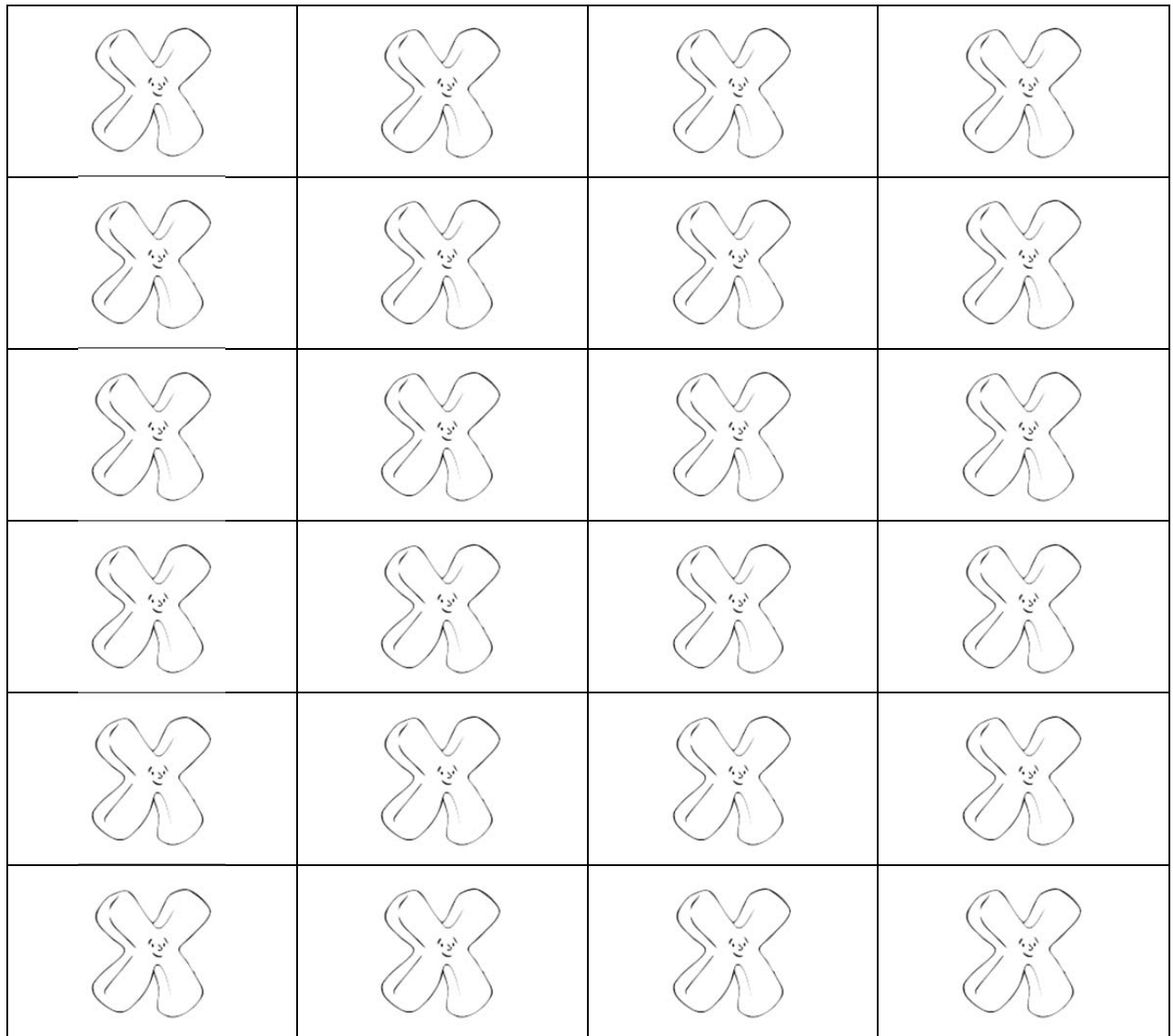
- Gameboard (2-3 players per gameboard)
- Game cards for each topic of play (print each topic on a different color of paper if you want to tell them apart easily) These must be printed DOUBLE-SIDED!!!
- Player Cards for each player (or marble markers in a different color for each player)

### How to play:

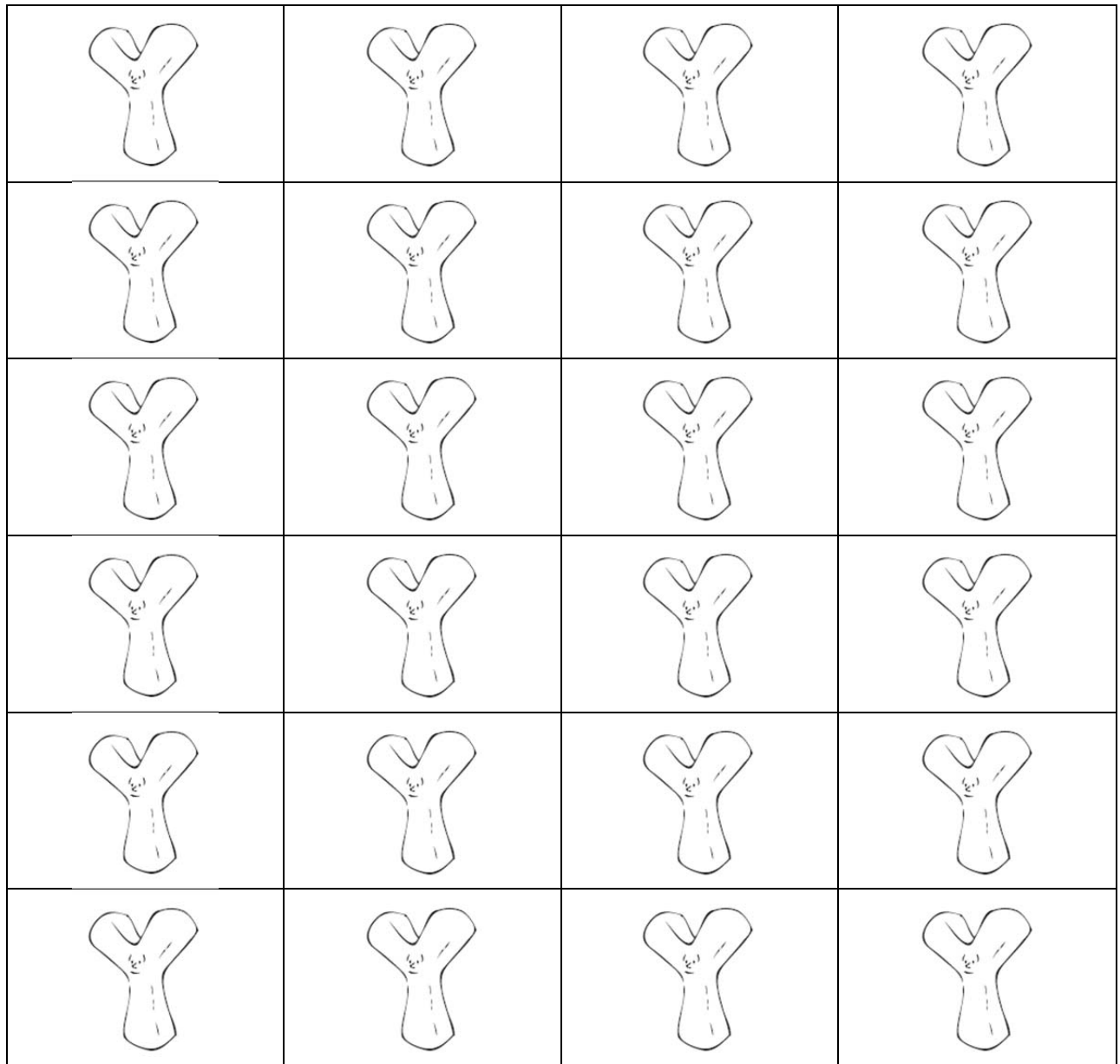
1. Place all the game cards on the gameboard.
2. The goal is to claim four spaces in a row, column, or diagonal.
3. Players always take turns. To claim a spot on the board the player has to answer the question on the card (or simplify), and then checks the answer on the back.
  - a. If they are correct, they get to stake a claim on the space. Now it is the turn of the other (or next) player.
  - b. If they are incorrect, their opponent (or next player) gets to claim the space. It is now the turn of the opponent (or next player).
4. The goal is to place four player ID cards on the board in a row, column, or on a diagonal.
